KEITHHALL ORGAN PIPES


Way back in 2020, just before the big lockdown we were approached by an artist who was commissioned by the Great Ormond Street Hospital.

The Session had previously tried to sell the organ in its entirety but to no avail, so when the Kirk Session were approached we thought this a great idea and a very worthwhile cause so it was decided to gift the pipes to this project.

Pat received an email just days before we went into lockdown to say that a young lady was driving all the way up in a hire van to Keithhall Church. Pat and I met here in the dark, we helped her take the pipes out of their cradles and carefully she loaded the many pipes into the van – she set off (having stayed the night at Thainstone) back down the road to London. The following day we were in full lockdown!

Time passed and we duly received an email to say that the organ pipes had been placed in the new sensory building.





KEITHHALL ORGAN PIPES

The commission was to design an 'acoustic chandelier' using 12 fully functioning organ pipes. This work responds to people's movement in the staircase; as you climb and descend the stairs sensors are triggered which activates the pipes to gently play. The notes chosen for the pipes drive from Pythagorean harmonics which were identified by the ancient Greek philosopher for their therapeutic qualities.

The installation is called "Pythagoras Stairs" by Oliver Beer and was funded by the Valentine's Party.

What a great feeling to have contributed to such a wonderful art installation doing good to those who truly need our help and yes we added a little bit to their story!

The GOSH Sight and Sound Centre opened in June 2021 supported by Premier Inn will transform the experience and care of children and young people from across the UK. Patients and over 100 clinicians have moved from outdated existing facilities into the bespoke, multi-disciplinary Centre designed especially for these children's sensory needs.

A first-of-its-kind for children in the UK, the Centre features state-of-the-art sound-proofed booths for hearing tests, an eye imaging suite, a dispensing opticians and other testing facilities. There is also a sensory garden with plants that children can see, touch, smell and hear, and bespoke and engaging artworks especially commissioned for children with sensory loss.

Children with sensory loss have unique needs, and thanks to this new facility, our expert teams can treat them in surroundings that will enhance their overall experience of coming to GOSH, taking away some of the challenges or worries they faced in our older spaces.

Lord God, fill us with the love of Christ,

Keithhall Church. (No one else wants to take up the roll.)


I was born and brought up in Aberdeen but have stayed in Blackburn for over 42 years.
